



Lest we forget

Mulbarton Parish Council welcomes your views on the proposal for a new War Memorial in the village.

Did you know that there are 2 War Memorials in the village?

One is a wall plaque inside Mulbarton Church, giving the names of parishioners who gave their lives in both the First and Second World Wars. The clock in the Church tower is the second war memorial both of which are complimented by the Roll of Honour in the Church Porch.

However, as it is 100 years on from the end of the First World, is now the right time for the current residents of Mulbarton to create our own memorial to all those (not just those from Mulbarton) who gave their lives and who served, not only in the two World Wars, but also in other conflicts since?

The intention is that any new memorial would be located in a prominent position in the village that we all pass by or can go to reflect and remember.

A new memorial could be a freestanding traditional design such as a cross or obelisk that is seen in many villages or it could be something more contemporary such as the shard recently erected as a war memorial in Brundall which carries the words of the poem "Lest we Forget".

How much will it cost? This is difficult to estimate and will depend very much on what is decided taking into account any design fees and the type of material used.
